

KAY COUNTY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

CUSTODY:

Section 1 - The Secretary-Treasurer shall have custody of the record copies of the Constitution and By-Laws of the "Kay County Amateur Radio Club" and shall have same present at each regular, annual and special meeting. He shall cause all amendments, changes or additions to be noted therein and shall permit such record copies to be consulted by members on request.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 - Membership in Kay County Amateur Radio Club shall be limited to those eligible under the terms of Article I of the Constitution, and such membership shall be composed of the following classes:

Charter membership: Composed of those holding a valid amateur license who were instrumental in the forming of this organization as evidenced by their signatures on the original copy of the Constitution.

Active membership: Composed of those members who regularly pay dues, attend meetings, and hold a valid amateur license.

Associate membership: Composed of those members who regularly pay dues and attend meetings, but do not hold a valid amateur license.

PRIVILEGES

Section 2 - Charter and active members shall have full voting powers and privileges of participation in all activities of the organization, including election to office, provided such members are in good standing as to attendance and payment of dues, subject to the following limitations as to the holding of office:

Charter and Active members shall be eligible for election to any office of the club.

Associate members may attend meetings and actively participate in the programs thereof and all other activities except that they shall not exercise voting powers.

ARTICLE III - MEETINGS

REGULAR

Section 1 - Regular meetings shall be held each calendar month at such time and place as the president shall designate, except that in instance of holidays or similar conflict with regular meeting dates, the president shall have authority to designate another day as a regular meeting date.

SPECIAL

Section 2 - Special meetings may be called by the president upon receipt of a request from any five active members or on his own initiative in event of special emergency or circumstances. Notice of special meetings shall be sent to all members so as to reach them not less than 24 hours before the designated meeting time. Such notices shall inform members of the reason for such special meeting and no business except that designated on the notice shall be transacted at the special meeting.

ANNUAL

Section 3 - Annual meetings shall be held as provided in Article II of the Constitution.

ARTICLE IV - DUES AND ASSESSMENTS

SUSPENSION FOR NON-PAYMENT

Section 1 - Members shall automatically become ineligible to participate in club activities upon non-payment of dues for three consecutive months. The Secretary-Treasurer shall notify members of such ineligibility, and the member shall be barred from further active participation in affairs of the organization until further action on the part of the members.

ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP IN AFFILIATED SOCIETIES

A.R.R.L.

Section 1 - It shall be the purpose of Kay County Amateur Radio Club among other aims, to procure and maintain affiliation with the American Radio Relay League by maintaining at least 51 percent of its active membership as members of the ARRL.

Section 2 - In order that all application the ARRL by members of KCARC shall be properly credited to this organization, such application shall be placed through the Secretary-Treasurer at the regular rate therefore.

Section 3 - It shall not be the aim of KCARC to require membership in ARRL or any other organization as a prerequisite for its own membership but, believing that affiliation with ARRL is desirable, encouragement shall be made toward membership therein.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

PROGRAM COMMITTEE

Section 1 - At the beginning of each term of office the president shall appoint a chairman of the program committee, who in turn shall select a committee of two or more. It shall be the duty of this chairman and committee to plan programs, special events and functions not requiring the attentions of the general membership.

PUBLICITY

Section 2 - At the beginning of each term of office the president shall appoint a publicity chairman who may at his discretion, select one or more assistants to aid in matters of publicity. It shall be the duty of this appointee to secure proper publicity on meetings, programs, and special activities or events through the media of printed material, newspapers or radio broadcasts.

The foregoing By-Laws read, discussed and adopted in the form as set forth above, by "Kay County Amateur Radio Club" at a regular business meeting in Ponca City, Okla. on February 21st, 1985.
